- **New Document Required:** Resolution by board authorizing the IGA between the municipality and Cook County
  - Submit with signed IGA
- **New Treasury Reporting Requirements:** All municipalities must register with SAM.gov by **September 1, 2020**
  - Reporting requirement issued July 31, 2020
  - May already be registered

# Register with SAM.gov

As of July 31<sup>st</sup>, US Treasury requires all subrecipients of CRF funds (including municipalities) to register on SAM.gov.

- Required information for free registration
  - DUNS Number, Legal Business Name, and Physical Address
  - Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)
  - Bank routing number, account number, bank account type
- **Must register by September 1, 2020**

# FEMA Public Assistance

## *What is it?*


- 1 A grant program from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for government agencies and non-profit entities to respond to significant disasters.
- 2 Activated by a presidentially disaster declaration, which occurred on March 26, 2020 for the State of Illinois.
- 3 A cost-share grant, where the federal government reimburses for a portion of the eligible costs and applicants are responsible for the remainder. 75%/25% for COVID-19.
- 4 Overseen by FEMA, managed and administered by the State (generally) as grantee, and passed down to subrecipients.

Assistance provided through FEMA PA is subject to a cost share:

- The Federal share is not less than **75% of the eligible costs**.
- Although the Federal share is usually 75%, if actual Federal obligations, excluding administrative costs, meet or exceed a qualifying threshold, FEMA may recommend an increase of the federal cost share
- Emergency Work may be increased in limited circumstances if warranted

# FEMA Public Assistance

## *Simplified Process*



### Online Applicants Can:

- Explain Work Activities
- Answer Basic Questions
- Provide Limited Supporting Documentation
- Provide a Cost Estimate

### The Simplified Process:

- Eliminates Exploratory Calls
- Eliminates Recovery Scoping Meetings
- Eliminates Most Site Inspections
- Reducing Documentation Requirements

## *Suburban Municipality Responsibility*

- Collect COVID-19 costs
- Document how these costs are COVID response related
- Prepare documents for submission to IEMA/FEMA for reimbursement

# FEMA Public Assistance

## *Eligible Costs Overview*

- COVID-19 costs are **reimbursable through FEMA-Public Assistance (Category B)** funding:
  - Through each state, FEMA is reimbursing 75% of cost plus a 5% management cost fee
  - Organizations can request 50% of amount submitted in the initial project worksheet (PW) as expedited funding
- Entities must identify **incremental costs** incurred due to COVID in areas including, but not limited to:
  - Force Account Labor (Permanent, Part-time, Seasonal, Re-assigned, Disaster Hires, Backfill Employees)
  - Force Account Equipment and Leased Equipment
  - Material (Purchased supplies and/or taken from stock)
  - Contract Services
- The FEMA program focuses on cost reimbursement, but revenue loss (for PNPs) should also be tracked as additional federal and state programs become available
  - Contract Services
  - Mutual Aid: mutual aid agreement must reference compensation

# FEMA Public Assistance

## *Eligible Costs Details*

Under the COVID-19 Emergency Declaration, emergency protective measures (response costs) including, but not limited to, the following, may be eligible for reimbursement through FEMA or other federal agencies.

- Management, control and reduction of immediate threats to public health and safety:
  - Emergency Operation Center costs
  - Training specific to the declared event (PPE training, medical shelter operations, etc.)
  - Disinfection of eligible public facilities
  - Technical assistance to local governments or eligible PNPs on emergency management and control of immediate threats to public health and safety
- Emergency medical care:
  - Non-deferrable medical treatment of infected persons in a shelter or temporary medical facility
  - Related medical facility services and supplies
  - Temporary medical facilities and/or enhanced medical/hospital capacity (for treatment when existing facilities are reasonably forecasted to become overloaded in the near term and cannot accommodate the patient load or to quarantine potentially infected persons)
  - Use of specialized medical equipment
  - Medical waste disposal
  - Emergency medical transport

# FEMA Public Assistance

## *Eligible Costs Details*

- Purchase and distribution of food, water, ice, medicine, and other consumable supplies, to include personal protective equipment and hazardous material suits
- Movement of supplies and persons
- Security and law enforcement
- Communications of general health and safety information to the public
- Search and rescue to locate and recover members of the population requiring assistance
- Medical sheltering (e.g. when existing facilities are reasonably forecasted to become overloaded in the near future and cannot accommodate needs)
  - All sheltering must be conducted in accordance with standards and/or guidance approved by HHS/CDC and must be implemented in a manner that incorporates social distancing

# FEMA Public Assistance

## *Eligible Costs Example*

- **Labor:**
  - Incremental (added staff or OT) staffing costs associated with COVID-19 (command centers, increased ED and urgent care staffing, EVS, plant maintenance, etc.)
    - Public health and safety **overtime** likely reimbursed by FEMA
    - **Non-overtime public health and safety employees reimbursed through CRF** Suburban Municipality Allocation
  - Incremental / un-budgeted traveler nurses or other Contract Labor
  - Staff training and preparation, if it results in incremental costs (i.e., OT)
  - Labor costs must be documented to the FTE level and for the specific assignment
  - Note: Currently FEMA will not reimburse for Exempt employee time
- **Supplies and Equipment:**
  - All equipment, pharmaceutical, and supply purchases associated with COVID-19 for public health employees (PPE, gloves, gowns, tents, beds, lab equipment, ventilators, etc.)
  - Computer purchases and network efforts due to work at home efforts
  - Purchase of generators
- **Other:**
  - Expense associated with adding capacity (getting new units ready)
  - Direct cost of testing and treating potential and actual COVID-19 patients
  - Retrofitting a clinic to serve as a hospital

# CRF vs FEMA

**FEMA may reimburse many expenses also covered by CRF and the County strongly recommends applying to FEMA before applying to CRF.**
