

Fair Transit South Cook

An innovative partnership to advance regional transportation



Cook County, in partnership with the region's transit agencies, is launching a 3-year pilot project to **improve transit service** and **lower costs** for the residents of the south side of Chicago, south suburban Cook and north Will counties. The pilot is anticipated to kick off in early 2021 by establishing a 50 percent reduction in Metra fares on the Metra Electric and Rock Island Lines and improved service and frequency on Pace along Halsted, a future Pulse corridor. The County will underwrite costs for each participating agency.

The Fair Transit pilot will provide south Cook County and north Will County residents with greater opportunities to make transit their choice for getting to work, school, shopping and regional destinations.

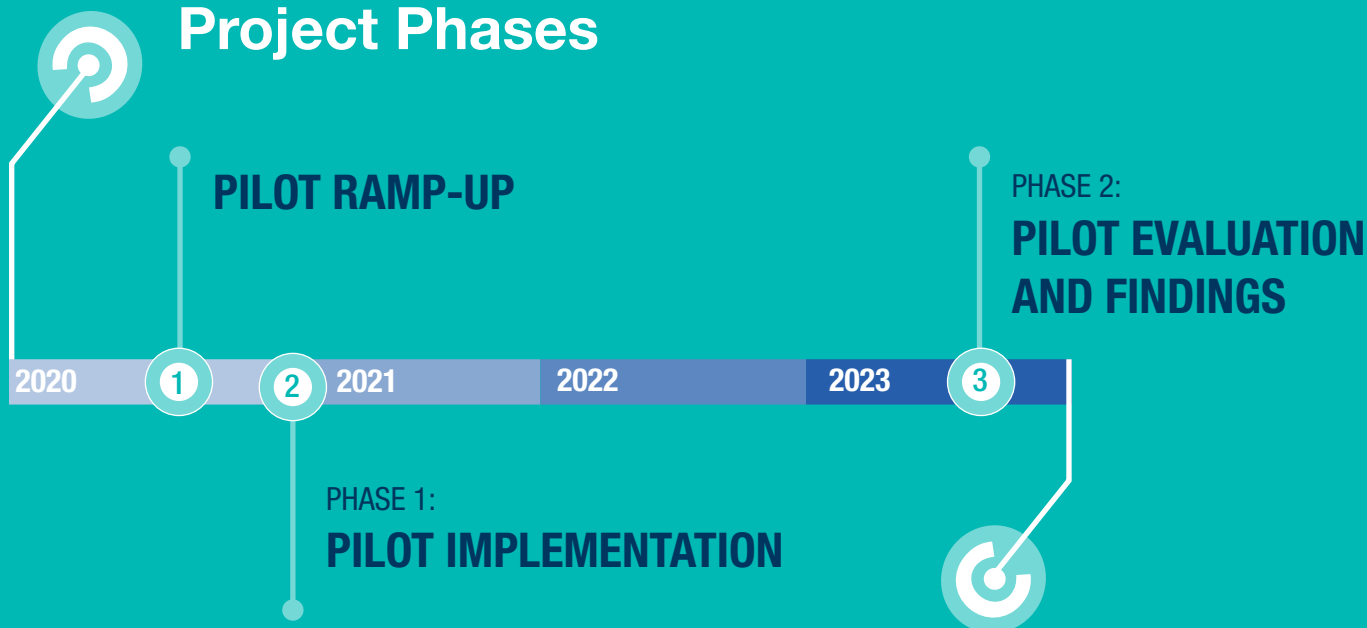

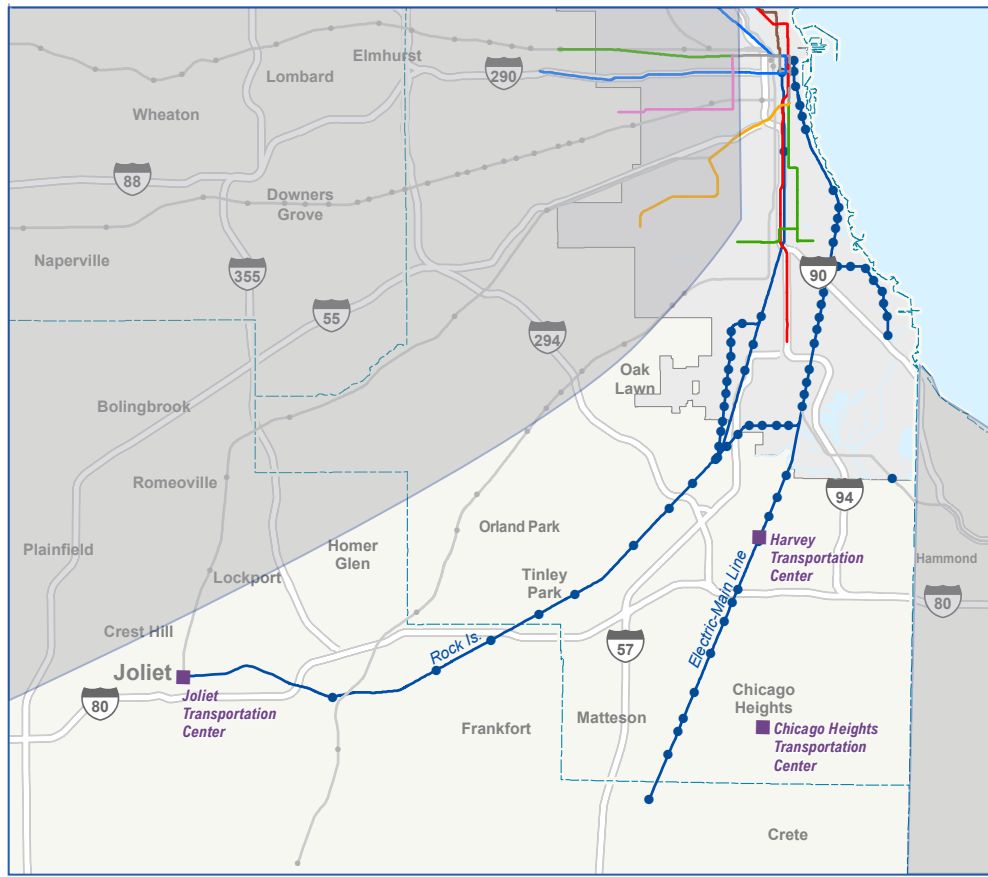
