Substantial Amendment to the 2017 Annual Action Plan

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SUMMARY

The Cook County Department of Planning and Development within the Bureau of Economic Development (the "County") currently receives Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding on an annual entitlement basis from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The County proposes additions to its CDBG-funded and ESG-funded activities to better meet community development needs in suburban Cook County and to allow for the expenditure of Cook County's one-time Supplemental Allocation of Program Year 2017 ESG funds. This requires a Substantial Amendment to the 2017 Annual Action Plan. This document, consisting of a narrative as well as required attachments, constitutes the formal Substantial Amendment to HUD. Each of these amendments will further advance the County's ongoing efforts to expend its CDBG and ESG funds expeditiously.

In its 2017 Annual Action Plan, the County indicated that it had agreed to be the lead entity for a regional Assessment of Fair Housing (AFH) that would include Chicago, the Chicago Housing Authority, the Housing Authority of Cook County, and other CDBG entitlements and Public Housing Authorities in suburban Cook County. While subsequent HUD actions have changed the landscape related to fair

housing requirements, this regional group is still planning to move forward. Enterprise Community Partners, who was going to be a partner on the regional AFH effort as described in the original 2017 Annual Action Plan, will now be managing the effort on behalf of the jurisdictions mentioned above. The Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning, who was originally going to manage the effort, will now be in a partnering role, along with the Chicago Area Fair Housing Alliance and the Metropolitan Planning Council.
