

Connecting Cook County


The Long-Range Transportation Plan set five goals for DoTH's work:

- 1. Prioritize transit and other transportation alternatives
- 2. Support the region's role as North America's freight capital
- 3. Promote equal access to opportunities
- 4. Maintain and modernize what already exists
- 5. Increase Investments in transportation

Invest in Cook

- Over 200 project awards supporting Connecting Cook County
- Multimodal
- Funds projects from early-stage studies and pilots to construction
- \$8.5 million annually
- Roughly 32 projects funded per year
- Average award size: \$233,000
- Average award rate: 45%

Invest in Cook 2022





Project Eligibility

- Any phase of a transportation project, including land acquisition
- Projects impacting any transportation asset under local, County, or State jurisdiction
- MFT eligible transportation related improvements to communities within Cook County
- Not staff salaries, equipment purchase, or standalone lighting and streetscaping



Applicant Eligibility

- Local governments, including municipalities, township road districts, park districts, and school districts
- Regional transit agencies
- Natural resource or public land agencies
- Private entities, including nonprofits in partnership with a public sponsor
- One application per municipal and township applicant

 - Note: Work should begin within one year of award
- Prepare supporting documents, detailed in the application:
 - Signed cover letter from the CEO/executive director
 - Map of the project area
 - Most recent financial report or proof of financial standing
 - Recent photos of the project area
 - Cost estimate
 - Funding resolutions
 - Additional studies or reports


The Invest in Cook 2023 program will:

- Transit connections do not currently exist for Village residents who want to access nearby Pace and Metra options
- Goal: make transit connections feasible for the municipality while identifying biking and pedestrian infrastructure improvements.










Freight – Roadway Improvements

- Goal: support economic development while supporting existing area businesses and recreational activities.








Chicago Avenue Reconstruction

Shermer Road Sidepath


