Vaccines	Medical (BCBS)	Covered at no cost-share to the member	Covered at the preventive benefit level at an in-network provider office and standard benefit level out-of-network
Vaccines	Pharmacy (CVS)	Covered at no cost-share to the member	Coverage continues until current supplies are exhausted or a commercial product is available (anticipated for summer/fall 2023) as part of the standard CVS seasonal vaccine program
Prescription Treatments (e.g., Paxlovid)	Medical (BCBS) and Pharmacy (CVS)	Medical visit covered at the member's regular benefit level. Prescription covered with no member cost-share while available under Emergency Use Authorization (EUA). Once there is an FDA approved treatment will be covered in accordance with formulary and copay tier

\* Health Care Flexible Spending Account (FSA): Participants can pay for eligible expenses using the debit card or can be reimbursed by filing a claim. The deadline for 2022 paper claim submission is extended to July 11, 2023.
