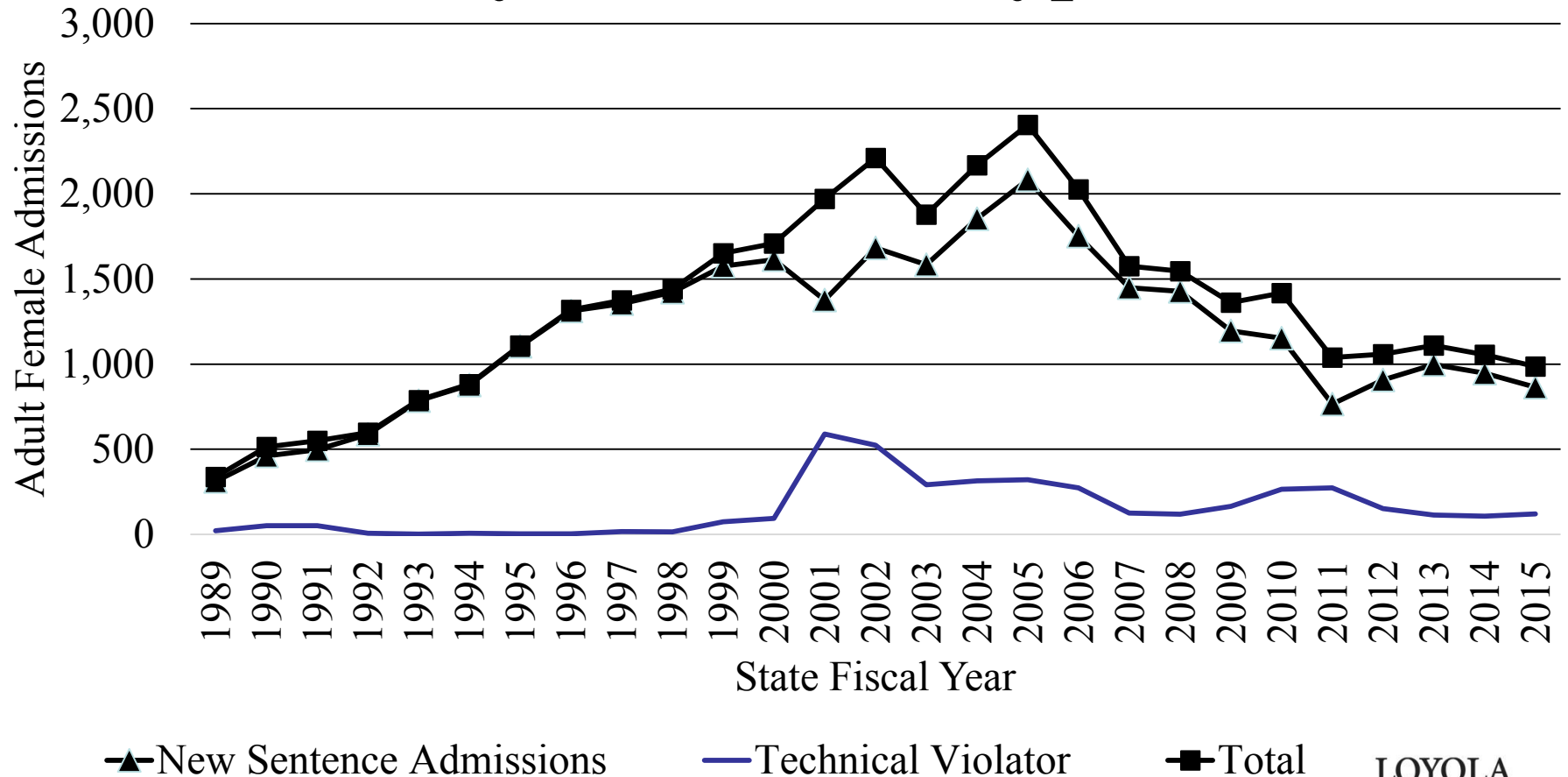

Context of Females Admitted to IDOC from Cook County

- Females account for 51.5% of Cook County population (Census)
- Females accounted for 14% of all those arrested in Chicago in 2010 (Chicago Police Department Annual Report)
- Females accounted for 18% of all those sentenced to probation in Cook County between 2009-2011 (ICJIA-on-line analysis tool)
- Females accounted for 8% of all those sentenced to prison in Cook County in SFY 2014

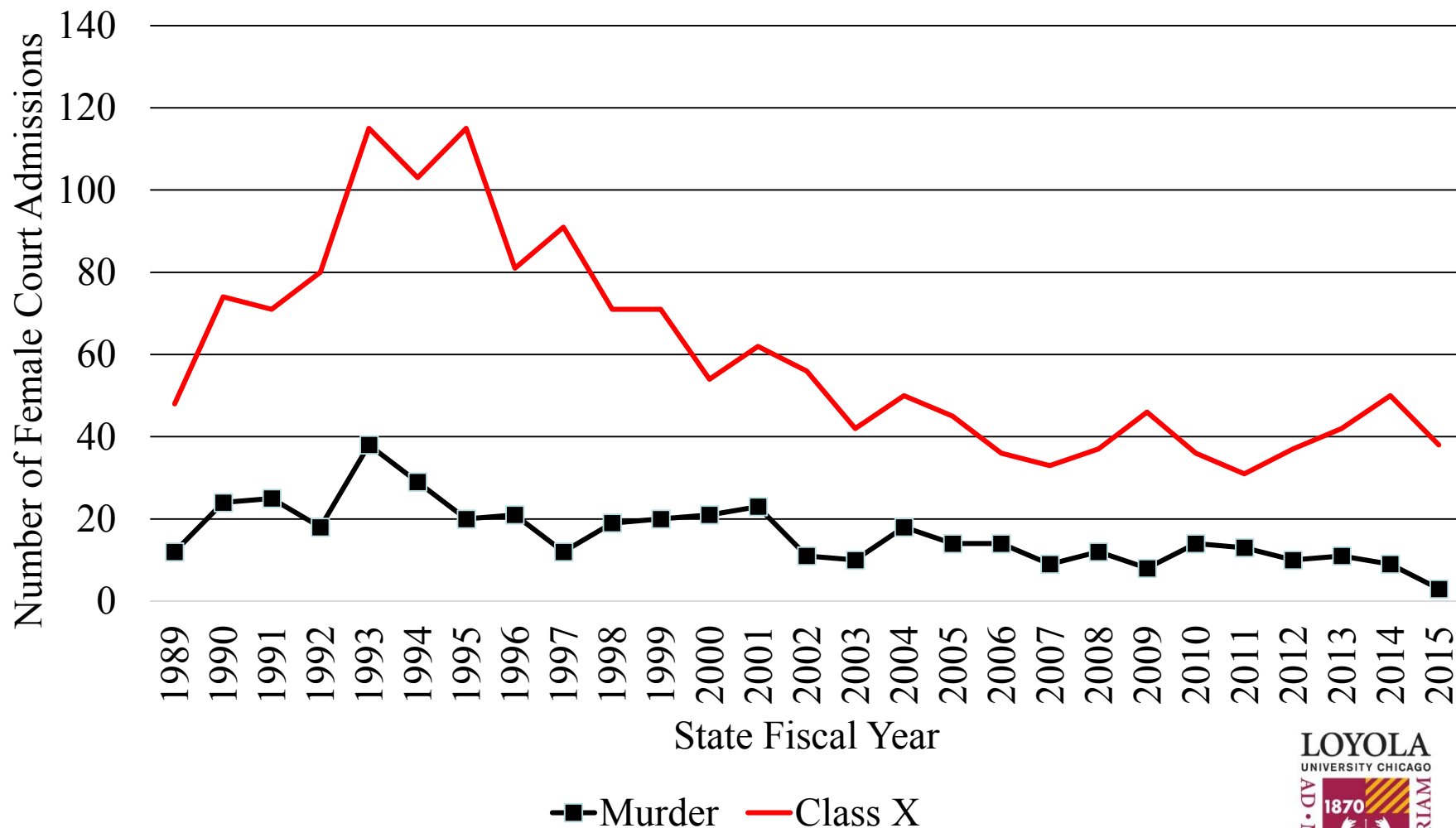
Percent of Cook County Female IDOC Admissions Accounted for by Technical MSR Violators

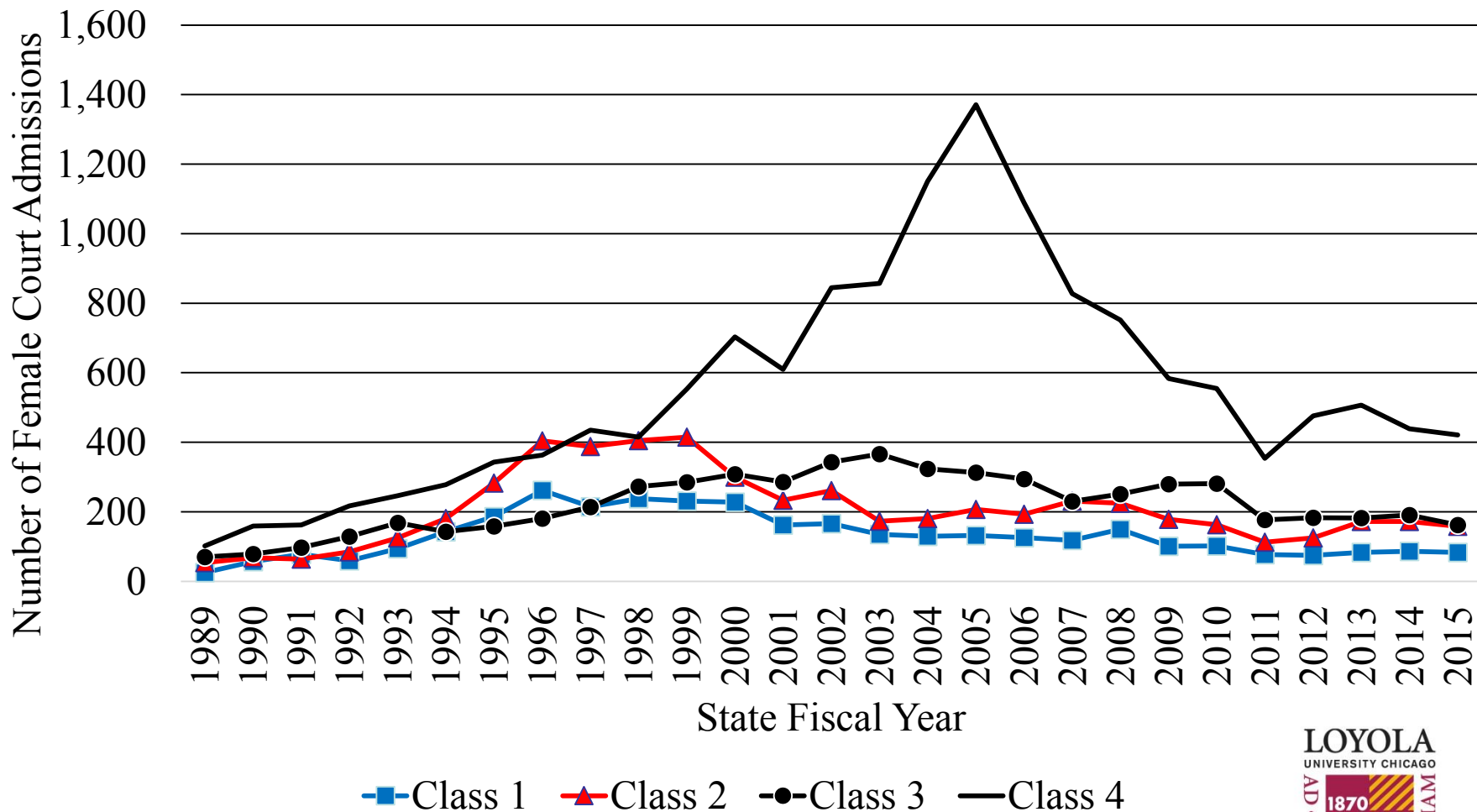
Cook County Female Court Admissions to IDOC for Murder and Class X Felonies

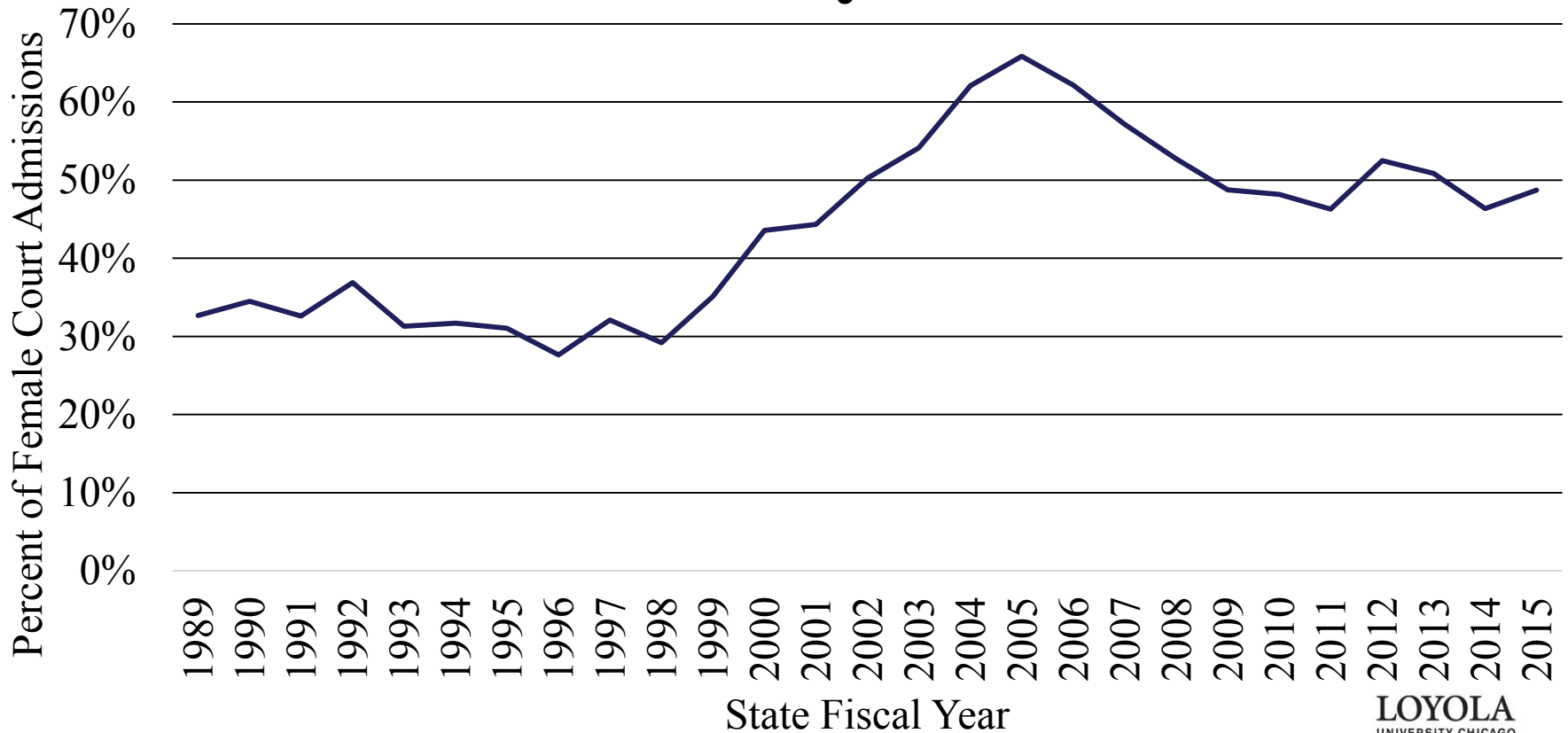
Cook County Female Court Admissions to IDOC, by Felony Class and Fiscal Year

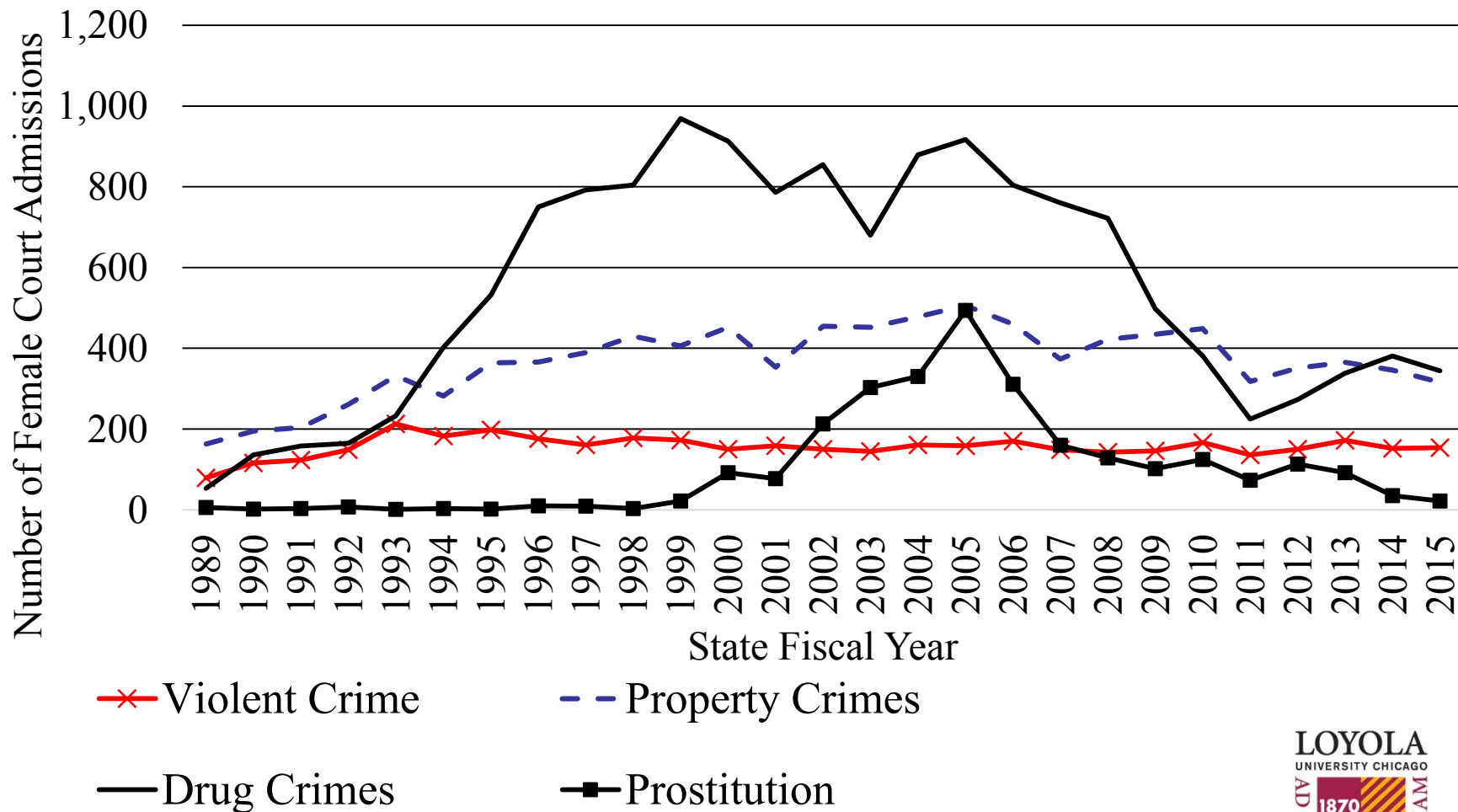
Percent of Cook County Female Court Admissions to IDOC Accounted for by Class 4 Felony Offenses

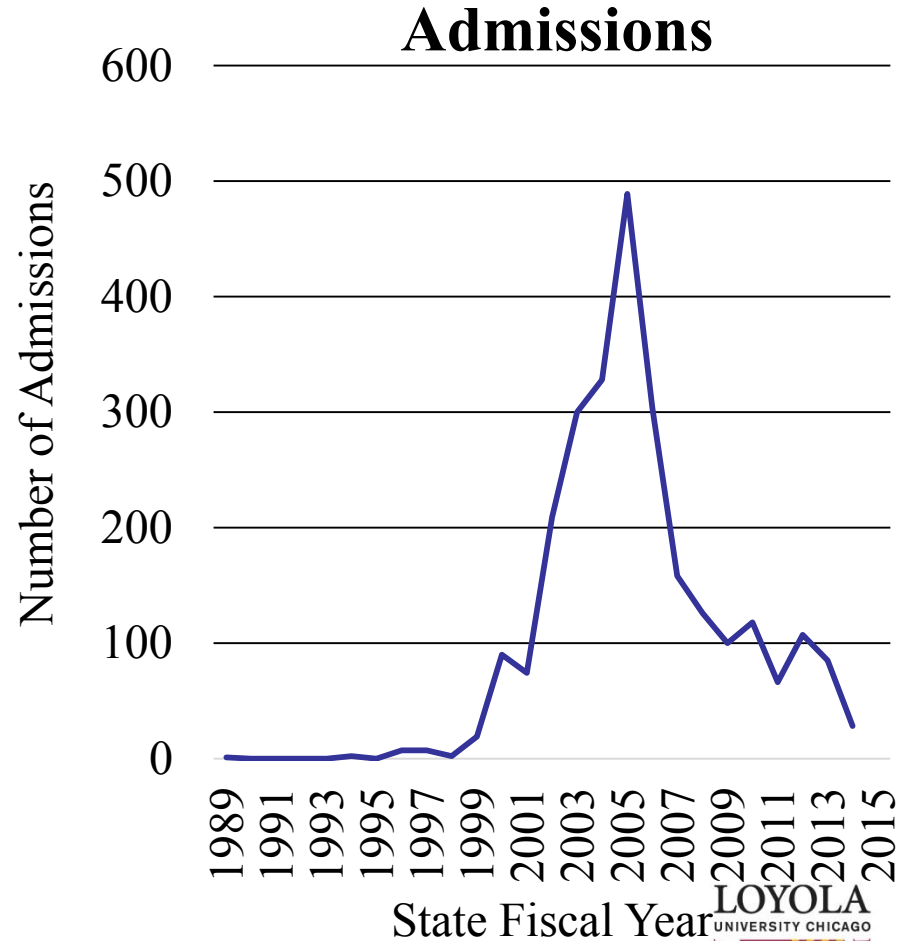
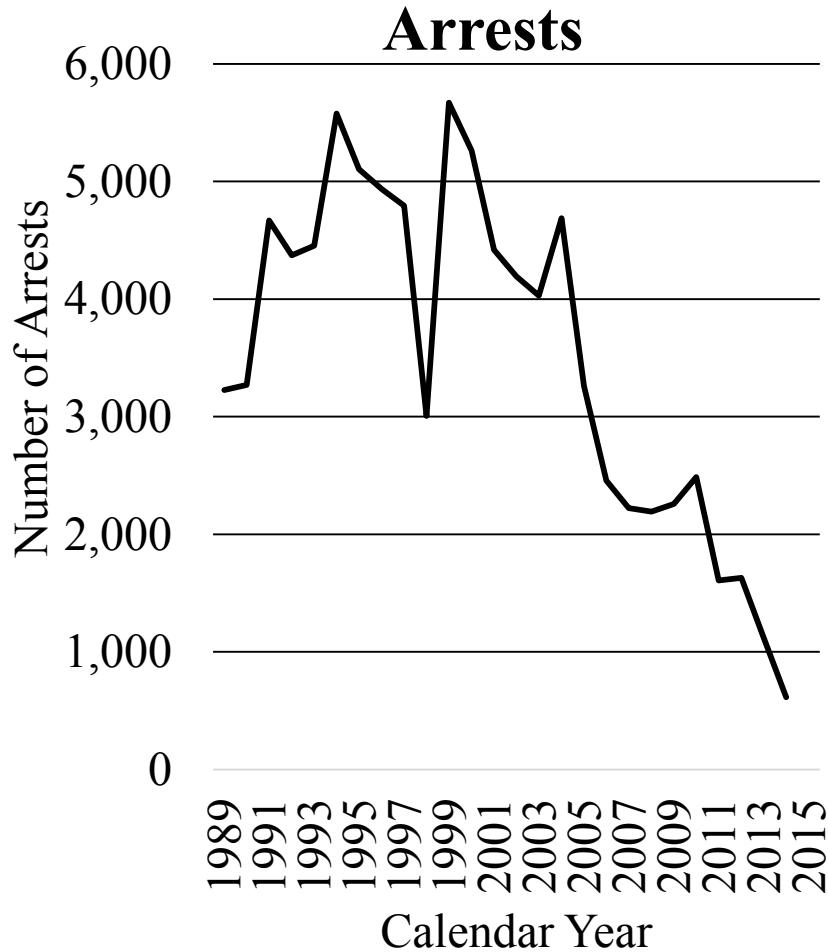
Cook County Female Court Admissions to IDOC, by Offense Type and Fiscal Year

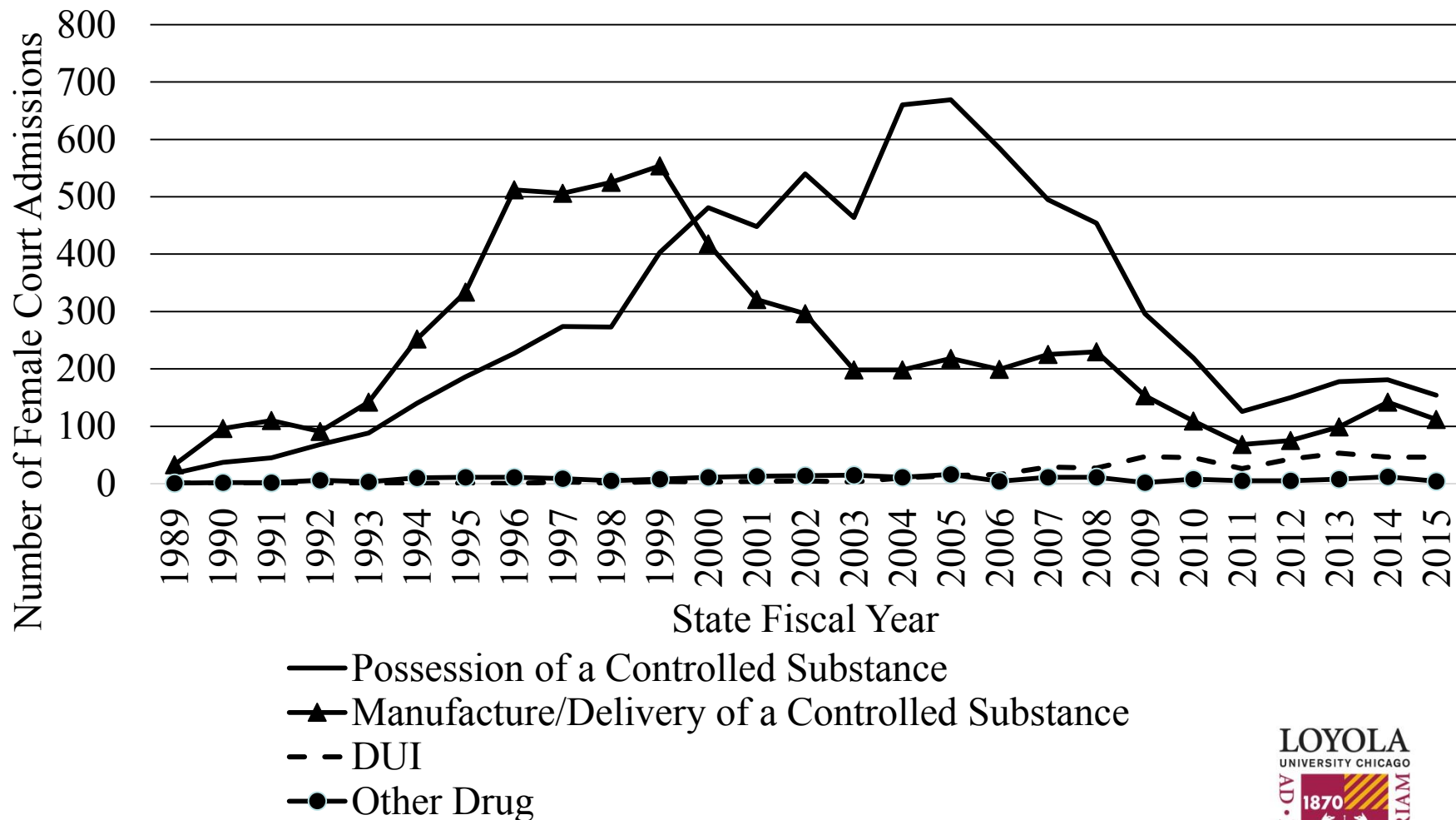
Female Arrests by CPD v. Admissions to IDOC for Prostitution from Cook County

Cook County Female Court Admissions to IDOC, by Drug Offenses Type

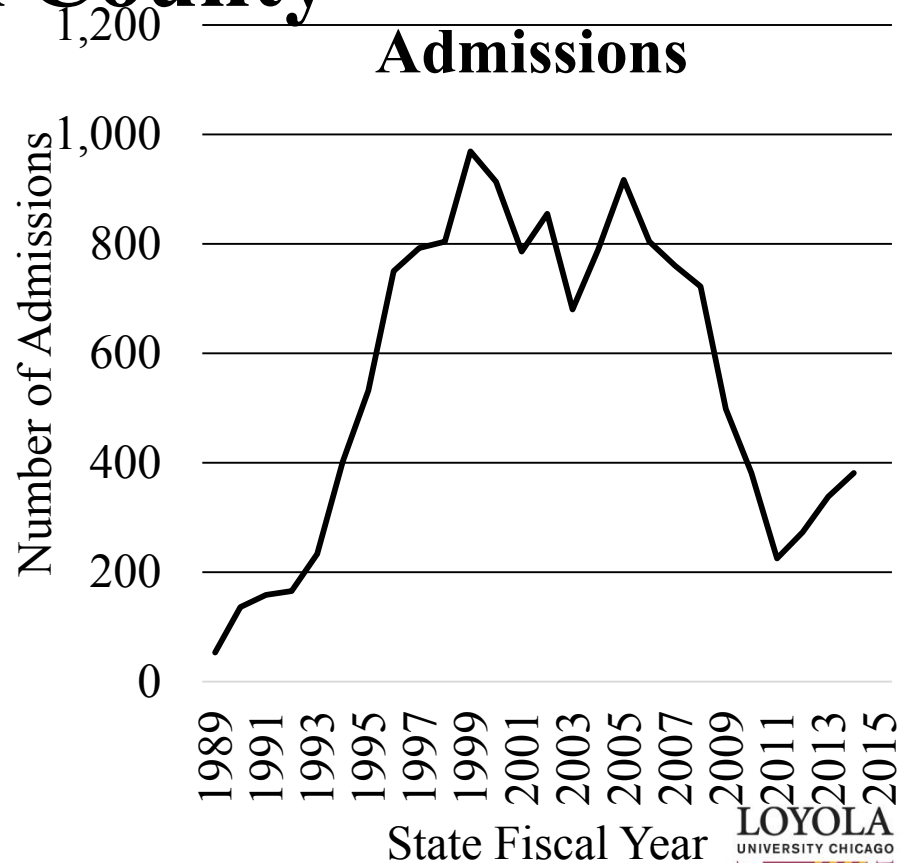
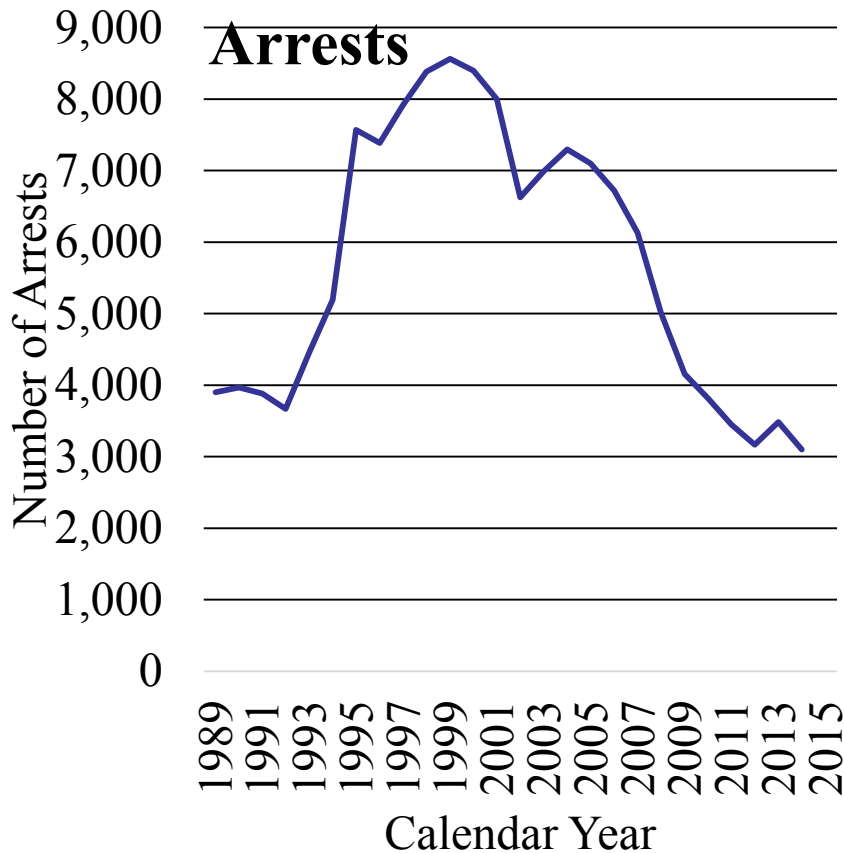

Female Arrests by CPD v. IDOC

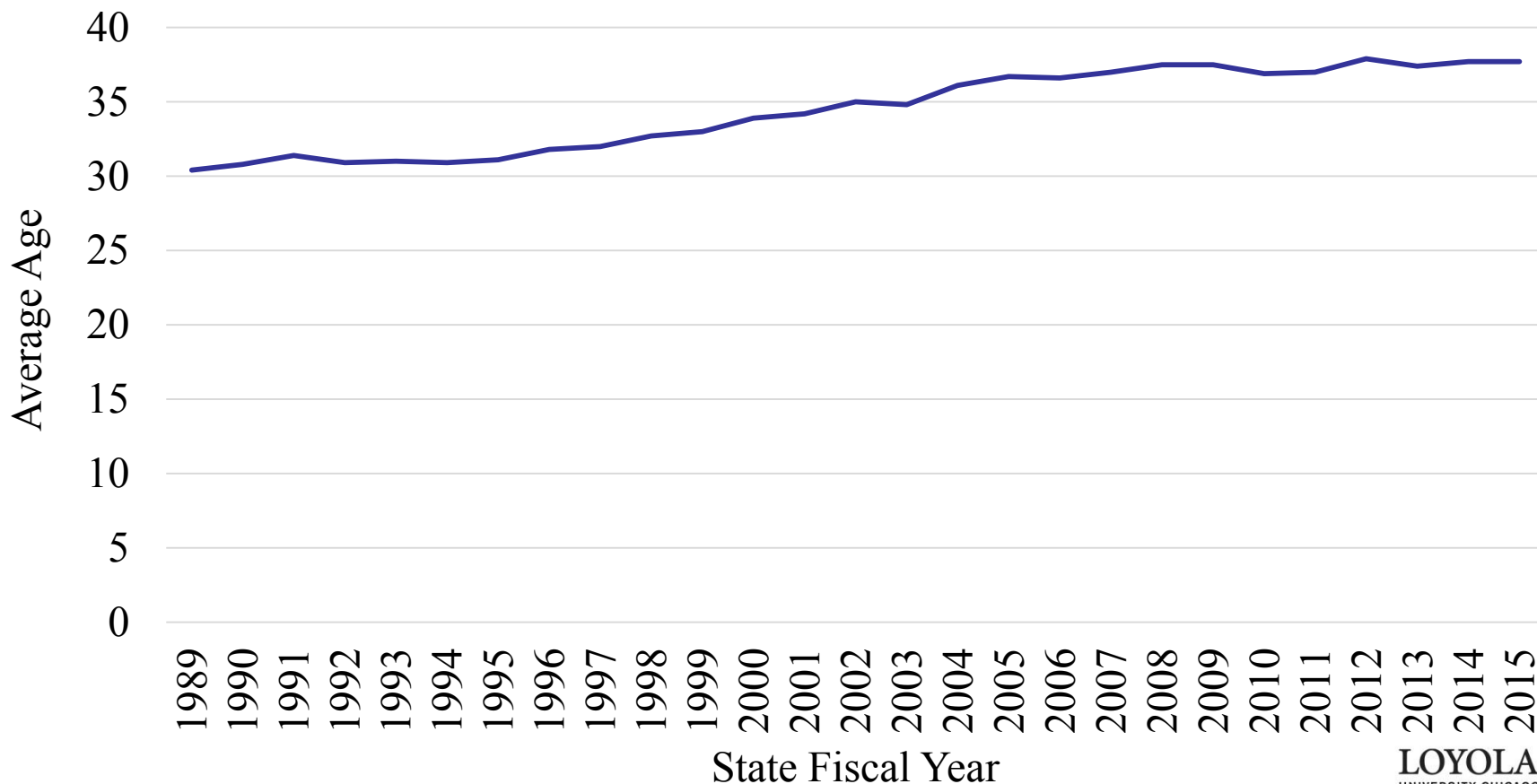
Admissions for Drug-Law Violations from Cook County

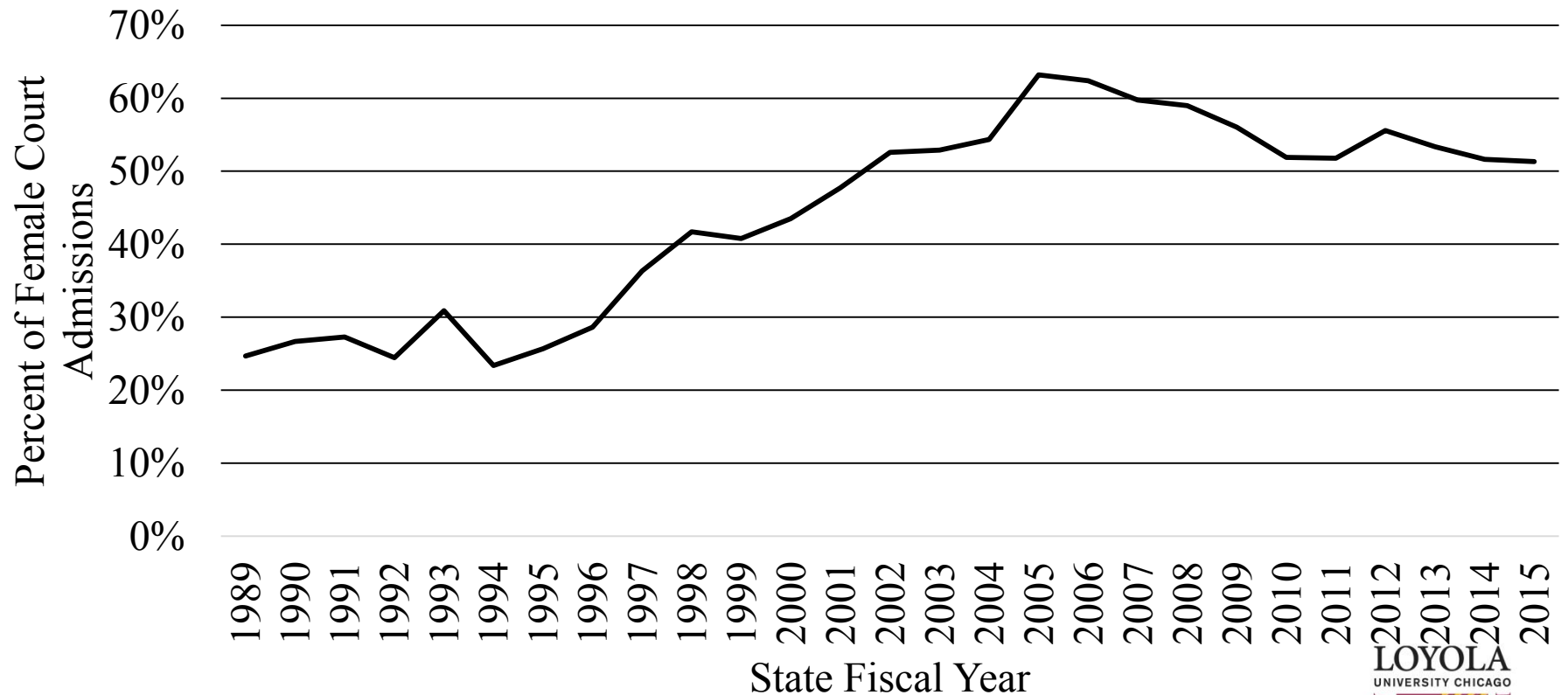
Average Age of Female IDOC Admissions from Cook County, by Fiscal Year

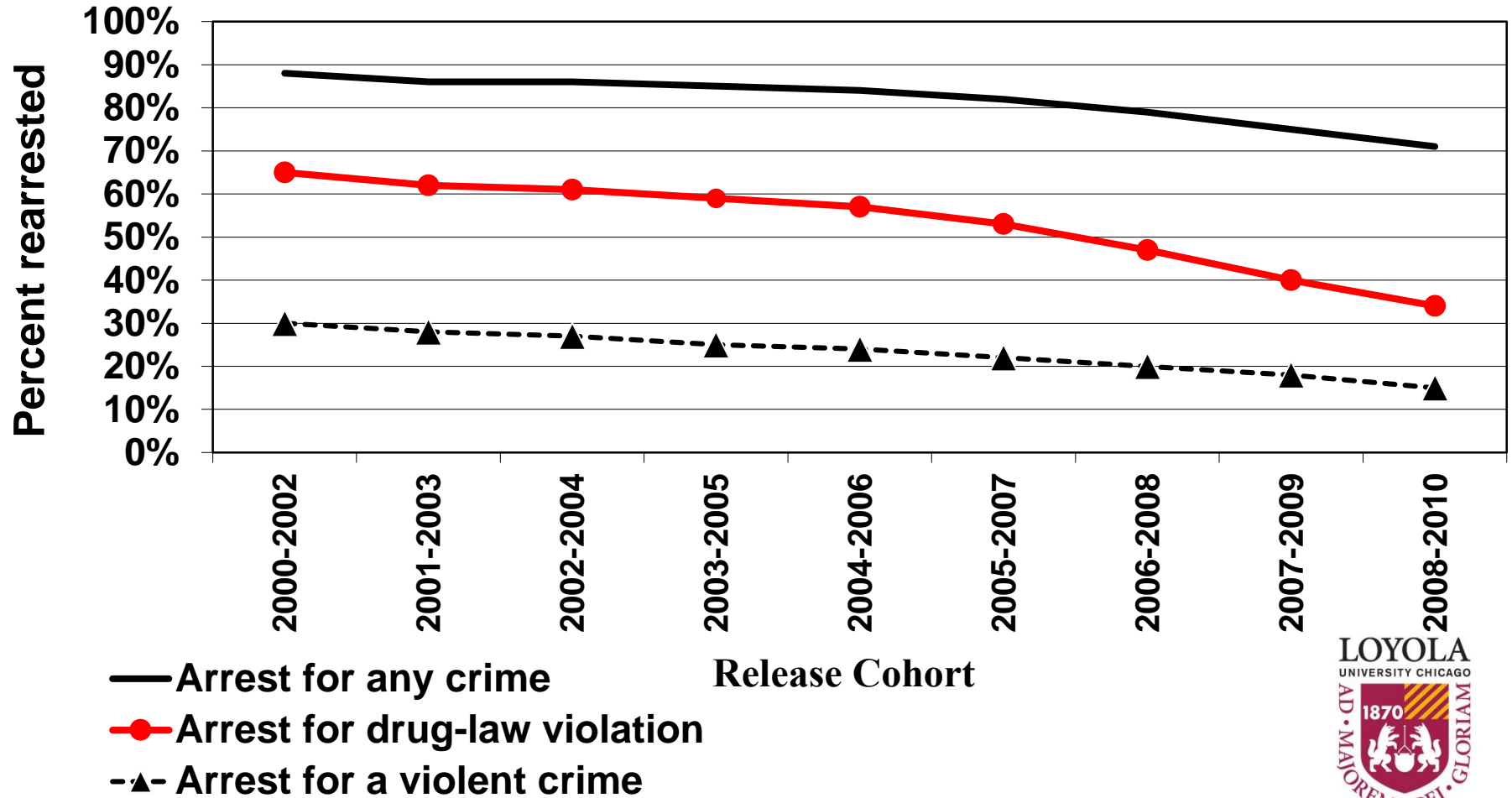
Percent of Cook County Female Court Admissions to IDOC that have Previously Been in Prison, by Fiscal Year
